## 2008 Program and Services Highlights



### Faith In Action Care Program - Respite Care, Visitation, Minor Home Repairs, Transportation and Caregiver Training Services

The Faith In Action Care Program allows older adults to remain independent with vital support and services. Over **5,369** requests for services were received during 2008. Over **275** dedicated volunteers provided in excess of **25,000** hours during the year in serving the needs of **1,115** individuals and families. Requests included: **3,088** Medical and Grocery Transportation trips; **395** Minor Home Repairs; and **1,850** Visitation/Respite Care visits for **46** families. Family Caregiver training was provided for **36** individuals during the year.



### Westview Senior Center Programs and Activities

The Westview Senior Center was designated a **Center of Excellence** in January 2008 by the Division of Aging and Adult Services. Senior Center programs include exercise classes, bridge, knitting and crochet, support groups, fellowship & games, health education classes, weekly art studio, driver safety courses and many other activities. Attendance in programs during 2008 was **13,343**. Programs were offered in collaboration with the Public Library, Arbor Acres, Salemtowne, Heritage Woods and Senior Services, Inc. **SHIIP** counseling was co-coordinated with Senior Services, Inc. to assist **210** older adults in making decisions about Medicare, Medicare supplements, Medicare Prescription Drug Program and Long Term Care insurance.



### Adventures in Learning— Life-long Learning

Over **200** individuals participated in two 4-week "mini-university" series held during the Spring at First Christian Church and in the Fall at Ardmore Baptist Church. Twenty varied course offerings were conducted during the two series by leading faculty from the community.



### Annual Used Book Sale

Shepherd's Center volunteers worked weekly to sort and price used books for the annual used book sale. Over **100** volunteers helped staff the 22nd annual sale from **May 1—3**. The event has grown to be the largest book sale in the Triad and draws buyers from the region as well as surrounding states. The sale, and related activities, resulted in **\$60,000** for the programs and services of the Shepherd's Center.



### Awards and Recognition

The Shepherd's Center was awarded the **2008 Joel A. Weston, Jr. Memorial Award for Non-Profit Excellence**. The Weston Award honors a local non-profit organization that has demonstrated organizational excellence. The Weston Award Committee reviews applications from local organizations and the recipient is presented with a \$10,000 award from the Joel A. Weston, Jr. Memorial Award Endowment Fund.
